Also submit -Major Streams; Keynote speaker; any side event such as workshops; contribution of the host institution/s (cash or in kind); the names of the individuals taking responsibility at the institution, and the proposed role of the host/s in convening the conference. **EOI should be submitted by 28**th **Feb. 2021.**
